- ¹⁸ When I thought, 'My foot is slipping', your steadfast love, O Lord, held me up.
- ¹⁹ When the cares of my heart are many, your consolations cheer my soul.
- ²⁰ Can wicked rulers be allied with you, those who contrive mischief by statute?
- ²¹ They band together against the life of the righteous, and condemn the innocent to death.
- ²² But the Lord has become my stronghold, and my God the rock of my refuge.
- ²³ He will repay them for their iniquity and wipe them out for their wickedness; the Lord our God will wipe them out.

- ³¹ 'Simon, Simon, listen! Satan has demanded to sift all of you like wheat,
- ³² but I have prayed for you that your own faith may not fail; and you, when once you have turned back, strengthen your brothers.'
- ³³ And he said to him, 'Lord, I am ready to go with you to prison and to death!'

Peter Denies Jesus

- ⁵⁴ Then they seized him and led him away, bringing him into the high priest's house. But Peter was following at a distance.
- ⁵⁵ When they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, Peter sat among them.
- ⁵⁶ Then a servant-girl, seeing him in the firelight, stared at him and said, 'This man also was with him.'
- ⁵⁷ But he denied it, saying, 'Woman, I do not know him.'
- ⁵⁸ A little later someone else, on seeing him, said, 'You also are one of them.' But Peter said, 'Man, I am not!'
- ⁵⁹ Then about an hour later yet another kept insisting, 'Surely this man also was with him; for he is a Galilean.'
- ⁶⁰ But Peter said, 'Man, I do not know what you are talking about!' At that moment, while he was still speaking, the cock crowed.
- ⁶¹ The Lord turned and looked at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him, 'Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times.'
- ⁶² And he went out and wept bitterly.

CP 527 How Firm a Foundation

- 1 How firm a foundation, ye saints of the Lord, in laid for your faith in his excellent word!
 What more can he say than to you he hath said, to you who to Jesus for refuge have fled?
- 2 "Fear not, I am with thee; O be not dismayed! For I am thy God and will still give thee aid; I'll strengthen thee, help thee, and cause thee to stand,
- upheld by my righteous, omnipotent hand.
- 3 When through the deep waters I call thee to go, the rivers of woe shall not thee overflow; for I will be with thee, thy troubles to bless, and sanctify to thee thy deepest distress.

- 4 When through fiery trials thy pathway shall lie, my grace, all sufficient, shall be thy supply: the flame shall not hurt thee; I only design thy dross to consume, and thy gold to refine.
- 5 The soul that on Jesus hath leaned for repose I will not I will not desert to its foes; that soul, though all hell should endeavour to shake, I'll never no, never no, never forsake.
